Kimberly Webb Brings Experience and Inspiration to the State's Longest-Operating Non-Profit

The Ohio Art League (OAL) is a proud member of the state arts community, supporting its 600-plus members across all stages of their careers. The venerable 106-year tradition of OAL continues with the announcement that Kimberly Webb takes the reigns of the organization as its Director.

"The Ohio Art League is a vital asset with vast potential locally, regionally and nationally," Kim stated. "I am confident in my abilities to assist the organization in realizing its potential."

Kim has devoted the last decade cultivating her career in various positions within multiple cultural organizations. From grassroots art galleries, such as Studio 243 and Chop Chop, to institutions such as the Wexner Center for the Arts, Columbus Museum of Art, and Columbus College of Art & Design, she has become well-versed in participating in, developing, organizing, and executing innovative and imaginative creative experiences.

Since 2007, Kim managed the Fresh A.I.R. Gallery, directing the gallery's exhibitions and educational programming, co-developing communications, event planning, and fundraising. During her tenure there, Fresh A.I.R. netted a national award for advocacy and several local awards for excellence.

"My active research in art, theory, community and current events motivates me to create meaningful projects that respond to our contemporary world," Kim continued. "Connecting people and resources is a highly creative act for which I have great passion; that passion has piloted me into becoming a natural leader with strong community relationships."
